

Your new Marble surface

Keep them looking great with our maintenance tips...

Marble is a metamorphic rock, formed within the surface of the earth over millions of years. It is slightly softer and more porous than granite, and therefore the most common use for marble in residential applications, is in the bathroom. It can be polished to a very high and consistent finish, and therefore is ideal for vanity tops, bath surrounds and cladding for shower areas.

Pitting and veining are natural characteristics and can be expected in marble. Some small fissures, blemishes and flaws are all entirely natural and are formed in the stone when cooling in the earth's surface.

To keep your marble gleaming just use simple neutral soap and water, and then buff dry with a clean cloth. Please do not use bleach or other abrasive surfaces such as baking soda or hydrogen peroxide, to clean your marble surfaces.

Products such as perfume, aftershave and wine can mark the polished surface. Ideally cosmetics and fragrances should not be kept on the marble, but stored elsewhere.

Calcite-based stones such as marble and travertine have a delicate chemical composition that can be affected by some cleaning materials.

Try not to stand, kneel or walk on your work surfaces to reach light bulbs or blinds, or to paint walls and complete other DIY tasks. Certain areas of the stone, such as near sink cut-outs may be slightly weaker, and therefore easier to break.
